



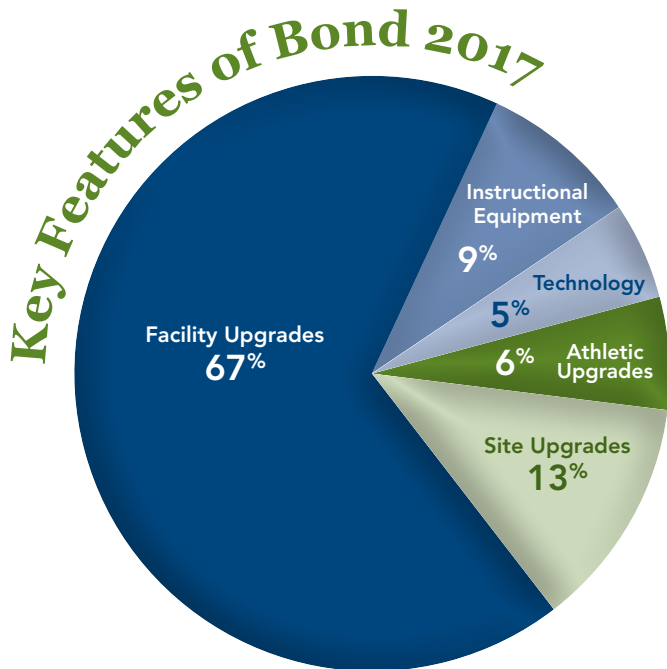

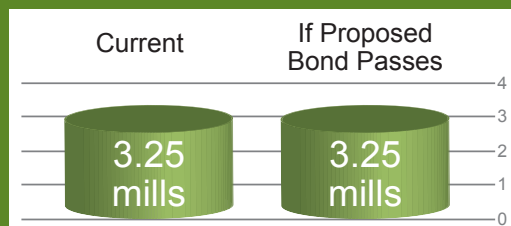
- Total bond program \$59.9 million

- Proposed upgrades will protect our community's investment in our buildings, which can protect property values

Facility Upgrades

- Remodel toilet rooms
- Add toilet rooms to GSRP (Great Start Readiness Program) classrooms
- Convert a portion of the learning commons to an active technology studio
- Provide ADA access to stage
- Expand cafeteria into former art room
- Replace marker/tack boards and finishes in classrooms
- Replace select doors
- Replace select flooring
- Replace select ceiling systems
- Replace lockers
- Replace physical education gym equipment
- Upgrade elevator
- Upgrade select mechanical and electrical infrastructure and equipment

Instructional Equipment

- Upgrade learning spaces by replacing existing furniture with new flexible and collaborative furniture

Technology Upgrades

- Upgrade classroom audio and video equipment and provide student devices to support digital learning
- Upgrade wireless network, access control systems, security systems, clock system and phone system

Site Upgrades

- Install electronic sign
- Replace fencing
- Upgrade play areas/equipment
- Replace site walks/steps/ramps

- Replace running track
- Provide ADA access to stage
- Upgrades throughout all learning spaces (select furniture, technology, finishes, etc.)

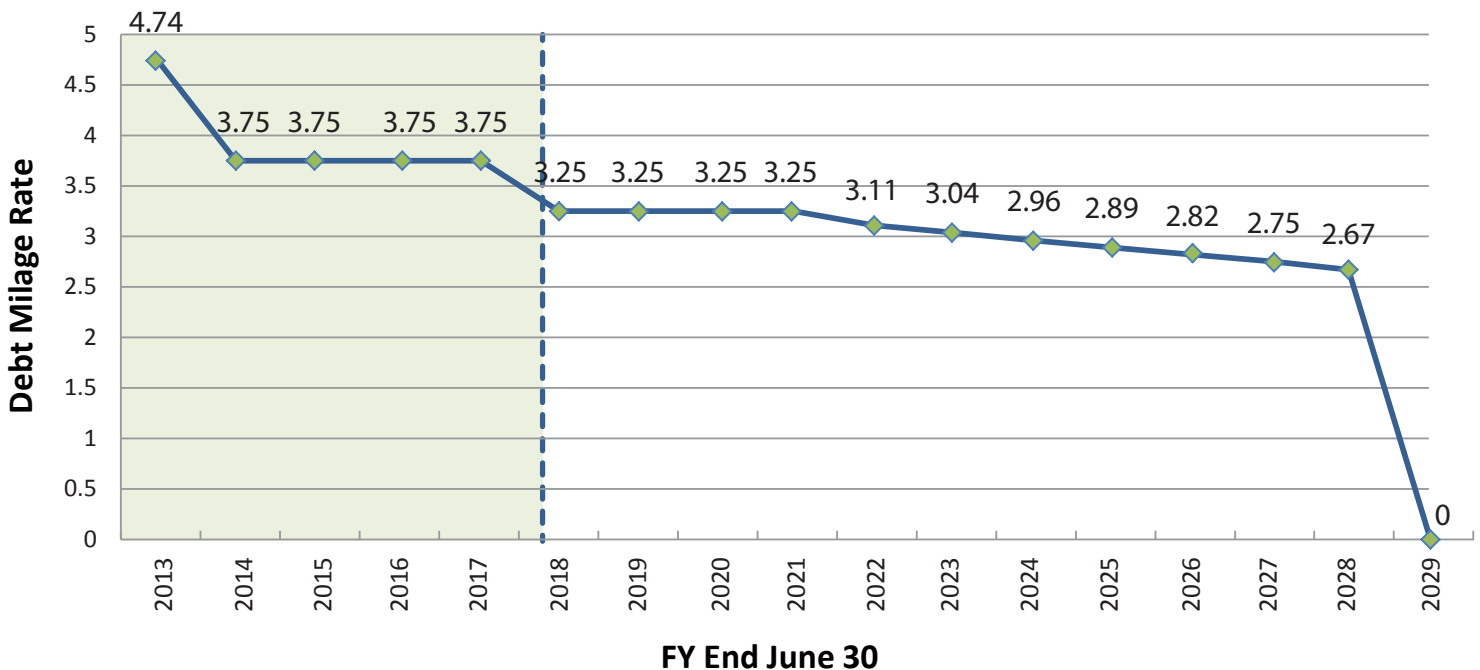
